A Story of Love & Commitment

Mitsy is a fun-loving, energetic dog. Like most dogs, she loves to get her belly rubbed and to jump into your arms for a hug and a slobbery kiss whenever she gets the chance. But Mitsy wasn't always this way...

Mitsy's story started at the Humane Society of Pagosa Springs from a place of tragedy. She lived in a home full of chaos, destruction and violence. She witnessed the tragic murder of her owner right in front of her eyes, and she came to us with an understandable lack of trust for humans and their intentions.

When Mitsy first arrived at our shelter more than two years ago, she was confused and afraid, which led to some aggressive behavior that made it impossible to handle her. We knew we had a long road ahead of us to help Mitsy become the type of adoptable companion we knew she could be.

Our No-Kill Commitment

Like in Mitsy's case, no matter how much care an animal needs, or no matter how long it takes for one to get adopted, we are committed to the well-being of each and every animal that enters the shelter. We spend whatever time, money, and energy it takes – and we explore all options available – to place animals with loving families.

In addition to her behavioral problems, Mitsy is a pit bull, so the stigma attached to her breed wasn't going to help her chances of getting adopted. But despite the challenges we knew were ahead, never once did we waiver in our commitment to Mitsy, her future, and our search for her loving forever home.

Before beginning to work with Mitsy on her behavioral issues, our first course of action was to give her time. She needed time to settle in at the shelter. She needed time to understand we were here to help her. She needed time to mourn her owner and grieve her past life.



As people who care deeply about animals, our first instinct is to quickly shower every animal that comes into our shelter with an abundance of affection and love. But we have to set our wants aside and understand that the needs of an animal can be far different than our personal desires. Sometimes, an animal just needs time and space, which can be a true test of our patience. And so for weeks, we gave Mitsy the time and space she needed to settle.

After seeing Mitsy start to relax into our animal shelter environment, our staff created a plan to start to address Mitsy's behavioral issues. Not only was she aggressive towards most people, she also did not get along with other dogs and animals. We knew she would have to be kind and friendly towards all people and animals before she could be eligible for adoption.


Every day, our staff spent time with Mitsy, reading and talking softly to her, feeding her treats and gaining her trust. Eventually, they were able to interact with Mitsy and

spend time petting and playing with her. Once she got more comfortable with staff, it was time to get her more comfortable with other people and dogs.

Another avid dog lover, Maria Depalma at Doggy Day Care, partnered with us to help further train and safely socialize Mitsy. Our staff would drop Mitsy off at Doggy Day Care regularly so she could spend time around other dogs. Her behavior training was extensive, but eventually Mitsy became a happy pup who loved to be around people and other animals.

Mitsy's road to recovery did not take days, weeks or even months. Our shelter staff spent nearly two years working with Mitsy to make her eligible for adoption.





Did You Know?

To be considered "no kill" in the animal shelter industry, a shelter must have a 90% placement rate. Although there are sometimes severe or terminal circumstances where saving an animal simply is not humane and euthanasia is an act of compassion, at the Humane Society of Pagosa Springs, we have a track record of placing 98% of all animals into forever homes!

We are so excited to share that in June, Mitsy got adopted by the best owner with the most ideal circumstances... lots of room to run around, other pups to play with, and someone who loves her dearly!



Mitsy is the perfect example of our no-kill commitment. We invest whatever time, money and care necessary to place each and every animal like Mitsy into their loving forever home. We love you Mitsy!


Through the transition, we have remained steadfast in our commitment to caring for our animals.

A Happy Outcome for Morris the Cat

Morris is a big, lovable orange cat who, like most cats, loves to lounge around and sleep. His story at the Humane Society of Pagosa Springs started from unfortunate circumstances...

A caring couple driving early one morning on Piedra Road noticed a cat having a hard time walking. He was assumed to have been hit by car. When the couple called our shelter, our staff instructed them to take the cat in to a local veterinarian immediately for emergency care.

When Morris arrived at Elk Park Animal Hospital, it was obvious he had sustained some serious injuries. An x-ray showed that his hip was severely dislocated and that Morris was going to need surgery. Dr. Thompson didn't hesitate to get right to work on Morris. He had surgery that morning and was transferred to our shelter for recovery and further care by our shelter staff that same afternoon.

Our shelter staff spent weeks monitoring and rehabilitating Morris to be sure he had a speedy and successful recovery. Morris is now a healthy and fully mobile cat again.

Like almost every animal who comes into our care, Morris had a happy outcome. He was adopted earlier this year and spends his days running, pouncing, jumping and – of course – sleeping!

The story of Morris is a great example of why our emergency medical care fund is so important. When a stray is brought in that needs medical care, our local veterinarian partners know they don't have to hesitate to do what's necessary to provide every sick and injured animal the care it desperately needs. That's because the Humane Society of Pagosa Springs will cover the medical costs and is then committed to caring for the animal during its recovery and until it is ready for adoption.

We are grateful to Elk Park for giving us a big discount on Morris's surgery, and we are grateful for donors who contribute to our Emergency Care Fund to help us save more animals like Morris!
